Section 106 grant

In addition to the above, UPC also received a grant of £67,529 in 2021/22 pursuant to section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 in connection with the Whistledown development. The corresponding agreement with Wiltshire Council states that if any of the grant has not been committed or expended by 6 September 2030 it shall be repaid to Wiltshire Council on written demand.

During the year ended 31 March 2022, £10,850 of this grant was expended on the purchase of play park equipment (leaving a balance of £56,679 at 31 March 2023).
